THE PRESIDENT of the Specialist Chambers ("President"), noting Articles 33(1)(c) and 46 of Law No. 05/L-053 on Specialist Chambers and Specialist Prosecutor's Office, Rules 172, 173(1) and 194(1)(b) of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence before the Kosovo Specialist Chambers and Rules 3 and 4 of the Rules on Assignment of Specialist Chambers Judges from the Roster of International Judges ("Rules on Assignment"), herewith assigns a Court of Appeals Panel for a new determination of Mr Salih Mustafa's ("Mr Mustafa") sentence in accordance with the "Decision on Salih Mustafa's Request for Protection of Legality" ("PoL Decision").1

I. PROCEDURAL BACKGROUND

1. On 16 December 2022, Trial Panel I rendered the "Trial Judgment" ("Trial Judgment"), wherein it, *inter alia*, convicted Mr Mustafa of the war crimes of arbitrary detention, torture and murder and acquitted him of the war crime of cruel treatment.² The Trial Panel sentenced Mr Mustafa to twenty-six years of imprisonment.³

2. On 14 December 2023, the Court of Appeals Panel issued the "Appeal Judgment" ("Appeal Judgment") wherein it affirmed Mr Mustafa's convictions for arbitrary detention, torture and murder as war crimes, but granted Mr Mustafa's appeal, in part, against his sentence.⁴ To that end, the Court of Appeals Panel reduced Mr Mustafa's sentence to 22 years of imprisonment, with credit for time served.⁵

3. On 14 March 2024, Mr Mustafa filed the "Defence Request for Protection of Legality with Confidential Annex 1 and 2 pursuant to Article 48(6) to (8) of the Law and Rule 193 of the Rules" ("Request").6

4. On 29 July 2024, the Supreme Court Panel issued the PoL Decision on Mr Mustafa's Request. The Supreme Court Panel, inter alia, "d) [a]nnul[ed] the Appeal Judgment only insofar as it relates to Mr Mustafa's sentence [and] e) return[ed][it][...] for a new determination of [his] sentence pursuant to Rule 194(1)(b) of the Rules".

II. ASSIGNMENT

5. Having considered the criteria set forth in Rule 4(2) of the Rules on Assignment, including relevant experience and expertise as well as availability at this time,
