Request for extension of time limit to respond to leave to appeal requests on decision KSC-BC-2020-06/F00450

Pursuant to Rules 9(5)(a) and 76,¹ the Specialist Prosecutor's Office ('SPO') requests a one-week extension to 6 October 2021 in order to respond to the Defence Motions² seeking leave to appeal the Decision.³ Absent any adjustment to applicable deadlines the responses would be due on 29 September 2021.

2. Good cause⁴ exists for the extension requested noting the (i) complex and novel nature of the matters adjudicated in the Decision,⁵ and for which leave to appeal is now sought, (ii) number of issues for which leave to appeal is sought (being 9), (iii) concurrent complex litigation deadlines faced by the SPO in this case,⁶ and (iv) extension which was granted to the Defence teams for preparation of the Defence Motions.⁷ In the circumstances, it is appropriate and in the interests of justice for the parties to have an adequate opportunity to brief the issues in question. The SPO respectfully asks the Pre-Trial Judge to grant the limited extension sought and to adjust the applicable deadline to 6 October 2021.
