## Prosecution request for extension of word limit

- 1. Following the Trial Panel's ('Panel') Oral Order,¹ and pursuant to Article 36(1) of the Practice Direction,² the Specialist Prosecutor's Office ('SPO') requests the Panel to authorise a limit of 10,000 words for its submissions ('SPO Submissions') on the merits of the challenges raised in the Defence Motion.³ Good cause exists in light of the importance and complexity of the relevant issues and scope of both the Defence Motion and anticipated SPO Submissions.
- 2. The statements given by Pjetër SHALA ('Accused') to the Belgian authorities in 2016 and 2019 are particularly relevant and important pieces of evidence, and the submissions requested by the Panel in response to the Defence Motion require a complex factual and legal analysis spanning several different topics. In the interest of fair and expeditious proceedings, the SPO also intends to seek the admission of the Accused's statements as part of the SPO Submissions.
- 3. In addition to addressing the relevant admissibility criteria under Rules 137 and 138 of the Rules,<sup>4</sup> the SPO needs to explain and address in detail the facts surrounding the 2016 and 2019 interviews of the Accused. The Defence Motion also contains challenges to the reliability of part of the interview records,<sup>5</sup> allegations about the respect of the Accused's right to be interviewed in a language he understands,<sup>6</sup> submissions on the applicability of Belgian law,<sup>7</sup> and a lengthy overview of the



jurisprudence of the European Court of Human Rights and other courts.<sup>8</sup> The SPO must thoroughly address these submissions.

- 4. Based on the foregoing, the SPO requests the Panel to authorise a word limit of 10,000 words for the SPO Submissions.
