TRIAL PANEL I (Panel) hereby renders this decision on the Defence request for extension of time limit (F00494).

I. PROCEDURAL BACKGROUND

- 1. On 14 April 2023, the Specialist Prosecutor's Office (SPO) filed the "Prosecution motion for judicial notice of facts of common knowledge and adjudicated facts" (Motion).¹
- 2. On 25 April 2023, the Defence for Pjetër Shala (Defence) requested a 10-day extension of the time limit to file its response to the Motion (Request).²
- 3. On 26 April 2023, the SPO informed the Panel, *via* e-mail, that it would not respond to the Request.

II. APPLICABLE LAW

4. The Panel notes Article 40(2) and (6) of Law No. 05/L-053 on Specialist Chambers and Specialist Prosecutor's Office and Rules 9(5)(a), 76 and 82(5) of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence before the Kosovo Specialist Chambers (Rules).

III. DISCUSSION

- 5. At the outset, the Panel finds that the Request has been submitted sufficiently in advance to enable the Panel to rule on it before the expiry of the time limit, which is Friday, 28 April 2023, as required by Rule 76 of the Rules.
- 6. The Panel further finds that the Defence has shown good cause, as required by Rule 9(5)(a) of the Rules. The Defence has convincingly explained that it needs additional time to analyse and consider the Motion, given the complexity of the issues set out therein and the number of proposed facts of common knowledge and adjudicated facts.³ In addition, the Defence is also preparing for the upcoming second evidentiary block.
- 7. Accordingly, the Panel considers it appropriate to vary, pursuant to Rule 9(5)(a) of the Rules, the time limit for the Defence to file its response to the Motion to Wednesday, 10 May 2023.
- 8. Lastly, the Panel finds that the Request may be reclassified as public,⁴ pursuant to Rule 82(5) of the Rules, as it does not contain any confidential information.

IV. DISPOSITION

- 9. For the above-mentioned reasons, the Panel hereby:
 - a. **GRANTS** the Request;
 - b. ORDERS the Defence to file its response to the Motion by Wednesday,10 May 2023; and
 - c. **ORDERS** the Registry to reclassify the Request (F00494) as public.
