with Mr. Shala from the detention centre - I hail him - by videolink. 1 I'm here with my co-counsel, Ms. Cariolou, Leto Cariolou; 2 Mr. Hedi Aouini; my case manager, Ms. Petravica, Dzeneta Petravica; 3 an evidence review assistant -- two evidence review assistants, I 4 think so, Judit Kolbe, Xhulia Tepshi; and Mathias Lenglet, who is an 5 intern. This is the same team than yesterday. 6 7 Thank you very much. PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: Thank you. Very well. 8 Mr. Shala, can you confirm that you hear me? 9 10 THE ACCUSED: [via videolink] [Interpretation] Yes, I do hear you, Your Honour. 11 PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: Very well. Thank you. 12 We will continue today with the cross-examination by the Defence 13 of Witness 10. We will sit again in three regular sessions of one 14 and a half hour, twice, a break of 30 minutes, and a regular lunch 15 break of one and a half hour. 16 Before we start with the testimony, I would like to ask 17 Mr. Court Officer to bring us into private session so that the Panel 18 can hear the SPO response to the two points raised by the Defence 19 yesterday about being put on notice regarding the allegations in the 20 21 confirmed indictment, and those were addressed also in private session. And for the record, it's page 105, lines 18 and 19 of the 22 provisional transcript of 1 May 2023. 23

Mr. Court Officer, can you briefly bring us into private session.

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1 [Private session] [Open Session] Reclassified Pursuant to F579

2 THE COURT OFFICER: We're in private session, Your Honours.

3 PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: Thank you.

4 Mr. Prosecutor.

5 MR. DE MINICIS: Good morning, Your Honours. I will be brief. 6 The Prosecution has pleaded with sufficient specificity its 7 case, both with regard to the alleged members of the joint criminal 8 enterprise and with regard to the conduct of the accused, as 9 confirmed by the Appeals Chamber in its decision IA -- KSC-BC-2020-04 10 IA004-F00008. And I would like to bring Your Honours' specifically 11 to paragraphs 15 to 21 of that decision.

Now, yesterday's questions to the witness about his previous statements, and I want to make that clear because it might happen again, were done simply for the sake of clarity and transparency. There are some differences. We wanted to clarify them for the benefit of the Panel and for the benefit of the truth-seeking process in this trial.

18 There is another remark that the Defence made about --19 concerning paragraph 31 of the pre-trial brief, where they claimed 20 the Prosecution was not clear as to the nature of its case. I invite 21 Your Honours to read paragraphs 32 and 33 of the pre-trial brief. 22 Your Honours will see that there is really no need for further 23 clarification on that matter.

The paragraph 31 concerns the arrest of 4733, who we stated was arrested with other people. Paragraphs 32 and 33 concern the arrest

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of Trial Witness 4-01. So we do not think there is the need to provide any extra clarity on that matter.

Defence made other submissions concerning evidence which is yet to be heard in this trial, concerning results of their own investigations. It is premature. We will not address these submissions. They will be able to cross-examine our witnesses, put on their Defence case, if they so wish. So at this time we have no further submissions in response.

9 PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: Thank you, Mr. Prosecutor.

10 Counsel, do you wish to reply?

11 MR. AOUINI: Good morning, Your Honour.

Our request remains the same. We believe these are material facts. If the Prosecutor knows the specific name of the named member of the JCE, we need to know it specifically. It's not the results of our investigations. It is the impact of the way we conduct our investigations that is at stake with that point.

And the other question about the protected witness is, we need 17 clarity whether the case of the Prosecutor is that Mr. Shala brought 18 him or not. I don't think the references given by my learned 19 colleague answer that with sufficient specificity, and we believe 20 21 this is a very important material fact. If the Prosecutor knows, and it seems he does, what his case is about this, then he should 22 specifically say it before we hear the evidence of witnesses so we 23 know the specific allegation we need to respond to. Otherwise we 24 will be in the fog regarding what is the purpose. That's why we 25

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intervened yesterday asking whether -- the purpose of the prior statements. We need to know what is the case of the Prosecutor so we know what position we take in response to -- in relation to these specific points.

And specifically on the first point about the named person. 5 The matter is there are many names and we only have a first name. So if 6 the Prosecutor knows who they allege is part of that enterprise by 7 first name and last name, it will benefit the debate in general and 8 it will alert the Defence, when they contact people with that first 9 10 name, for example, to know what they need and have to do legally to tell these witnesses. And when considering to call some persons or 11 put questions or prepare evidence, we need that specificity to be 12 able to conduct efficiently our investigation and the presentation of 13 our case. 14

15 So our request remains the same, Your Honour. We believe these 16 are material facts and the Prosecutor should specify them.

PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: Okay, thank you, Defence Counsel.
All the points of view are exchanged.

19 MR. DE MINICIS: Yes, Your Honour, I believe so.

20 PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: Okay.

Yes. The Panel has taken notes of your concerns, and we have heard the SPO, and we will deliberate on it. But for now, I would say I see no impediment to do the cross-examination of Witness 10. And if it is necessary, we will come back on this specific point to deal with your concerns.

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Very well. Mr. Court Officer, can you bring us into public 1 session again. 2

[Open session] THE COURT OFFICER: We're in public session, Your Honours. 4 PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: Very well. 5

Before we begin with the cross-examination by the Defence of 6 Wednesday 10, we will make an oral order, a short one, regarding the 7 request made by the Defence in an e-mail dating of 1 May, yesterday, 8 at 7.47, which included the request to add a document to the list of 9 10 items the Defence intends to uses with the Witness 10.

And we grant this request, seeing that it's a translation, an 11 Albanian translation of a document which was already disclosed by the 12 SPO on 21 September last year, with ERN 063313 till 063314 RED2, and 13 this is disclosure package 85; that the Defence has notified all 14 participants of its intention to use both the original and the 15 Albanian translation, which was yet to be finalised; and the Defence 16 has disclosed it promptly at the earliest opportunity after receiving 17 it. 18

This concludes the Panel's oral order. 19

Then there is another point we would like to clarify and that --20 to clarify the following to the Defence, yes. It is not necessary 21 for the accused to provide a waiver or a consent form if and when the 22 accused wishes to be present via videolink. It is sufficient that 23 the Defence informs the Panel, the Registry, and the participants 24 through an e-mail, at the latest, the day before the hearing if the 25

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accused will be participating via videolink or will be present in the courtroom. And the sooner we know it the better it is because that -- for organisational reasons that is useful.

And I recall the oral order we gave on 29 March of this year, and to be specific for the reference, that is page 833, line 7, to page 834 to line 8, and there we give some more details. But we hope that will facilitate the procedure in this respect.

8 Very well. Then there is a third point I would like to deal 9 with and that is a question of confirmation for the SPO.

We received your filing 497 on the notification for the order of appearances for the third evidentiary block, and do we understand rightly from this filing that you do not intend to call for the month of May, 19 May, a witness?

14 MS. WYLER: Yes, that's correct.

PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: That's correct. So in that case, I foresee that we will not have a hearing on that day, but I propose that we do not cancel it yet in our agendas because you never know what comes up. It's good to have always a day, a spare day. But as soon as it is sure that we will not be using it, I will be informing everybody that we can cancel it from our agenda. Yes?

21 Very well. Then we have dealt with all the points we had before 22 going into the testimony of the witness.

As we did yesterday, the witness will be appearing via

Is that what you mean, Α. 20 Your Honour? 21 PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: Yes, in terms of transportation. 22 Well, the commanders would actually collect them, as it were, 23 Α. from the various camps as suspects. 24 PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: And would they come walking or by 25

And the persons that were brought in and were put in building 1, how did you recognise that they were, as you called them yesterday, suspects? How did you know that?

9 A. When they would question them, some would be let go, and others 10 would be mobilised in the army.

PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: When they would come in, could you see that they were suspects?

A. Well, I was a guard, so it makes sense that being at the gate I was keeping guard, and I would be asking, "Where are you going?" And they would be saying that, "I've been suspected of cooperating with Serbs." And I would say, "Okay, thank you. Bye-bye."

PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: And when they would come in, come in to the premises of the headquarters, would you recognise them -could you recognise them? Would you know that they were suspects? A. No, no, no, no. They would be brought in for mobilisation purposes, and then they would be asking them questions in building number 1, in the rooms there, if they were suspected of that.

And I will call them up as a matter of procedure, but I will read out to you what you have said in that. But for the record, I will give the reference. This is the SPO statement from [REDACTED] Pursuant to In-Court Redaction Order F500RED. 108836-TR-ET, page 13, line 2. And the Albanian version would be page -- let me see. I will give the Albanian reference afterwards. In line 2, you said -- line 1 and 2 -- or maybe I will be more complete. Page 12 and page 13. And then at page 12, it's line 19 and 20. "How did you recognise them to be prisoners," you were asked. And I understand here prisoners were the suspects you talked about yesterday. And then at page 13, line 1, you say: "They thought that they were more dangerous. They had their hands tied. But, of course, when they went in there they would take away -- untie them." So I ask you again: Did these people, when they would be brought in, would they be -- would they have their hands tied? Α. Your Honour, it is quite possible that it might have been and I've forgotten. Because when they were brought in, sometimes they would be taken to the office by the commanders and sometimes they

would take them to pavilion number 1. They would bring them in by car and it is possible, as I said, that their hands were tied but I've forgotten. But in pavilion number 1, the hands were not tied. PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: Okay. But I -- you have said this to the SPO, and you may now tell us that you have forgotten it. But even when I read it out to you, do you recall it or is it still blurred?

A. I'm saying again, I might have seen him. Because by car, they would not bring them directly to pavilion 1 but to the offices, the commanders. So I could have possibly seen them. And they possibly had their hands tied, but they were in the cars and I did not see it. And it is possible that I told this to the Prosecution. Let me be fair.

PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: You did tell it to the Prosecutor, there's no doubt about it, because it has been recorded as such. It's for me just not clear. I want to be sure what you remember from what you have said to the SPO.

I owed you -- or I owed the procedure a reference. So the Albanian version is page 15, lines 1 and 2, with regard to the question, and page 13, it's in the Albanian version, page 15, lines 5 to 8. And then -- yes.

22 Very well. I have one more question for now for you,23 Mr. Witness.

Do you recall what ethnicity these so-called suspects would have? So the persons that would be brought to building 1, to what
