| 23 | MR. MICHALCZUK: Thank you very much, Your Honour. |
| 24 | Before we start the examination of this witness, I would like to |
| 25 | seek the permission of Your Honours to add to the presentation queue |

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one video, which is the video of the SPO interview with the witness,

- Part 2, and I'll give you the reference number in a moment.
- The reason for this late addition is that yesterday we discussed
- 4 two issues. The building, the white building, that was a subject of
- a contention, and we had a debate between ourselves and the Defence
- on it. And at some point, the issue of showing the video arose, so
- 7 we would be very happy to show it to the witness and ask for his
- 8 comments.
- 9 The second contentious issue yesterday was also in relation to
- the trucks being present, apparently, at the Kukes metal factory, and
- we would like to also show on video and ask the witness to comment on
- it. A very important issue, in our view. And we would like to start
- 13 with these two matters.
- 14 For this reason, I would seek Your Honours' decision now, if
- possible, before we start. There is no prejudice towards the Defence
- in this regard, because this item was already disclosed pursuant to
- disclosure 181 on 9 November this year. So the Defence is well aware
- of it and has it in its possession.
- 19 Thank you.
- 20 PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: Thank you very much.
- Defence, you have the floor.
- MR. GILISSEN: Thank you very much.
- As we said before, we are here to try to find the truth. So
- that's a fair way. And we don't have something to add about this.
- No position.

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- 1 PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: Okay. Thank you.
- 2 Victims' Counsel, anything to add in this respect?
- MR. LAWS: No, thank you, Your Honour.
- 4 PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: Okay. Thank you very much.
- 5 The Panel will allow for adding this to the presentation queue.
- 6 So we grant it.
- 7 And, Mr. Prosecutor, you may start as soon as I usher the

- 16 [The witness takes the stand]
- 17 PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: Welcome back, Mr. Witness.
- THE WITNESS: [Interpretation] Thank you for having me back.
- 19 PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: You can hear me well. I hear. I
- 20 see.
- THE WITNESS: [Interpretation] Yes, very well.
- PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: Very well.
- And, Mr. Shala, can you hear the witness?
- THE ACCUSED: [via videolink] [Interpretation] Good morning.

Yes, I can hear him very well.

- THE WITNESS: [via videolink] [Interpretation] I'm well. Well.
- 4 PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: Okay. Very well.
- 5 Mr. Witness, I remind you that you are still under oath to tell
- the truth. You understand that?
- 7 THE WITNESS: [Interpretation] Yes, I do.
- WITNESS: W03887 [Resumed]
- 9 [Witness answered through interpreter]
- 10 PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: We will continue with the
- cross-examination by the Specialist Prosecutor's Office, and I will
- give the floor now to Mr. Prosecutor.
- 13 Please.
- MR. MICHALCZUK: Yes.
- 15 Cross-examination by Mr. Michalczuk: [Continued]
- Q. Good morning, Mr. Hoxha. How are you today?
- 17 A. Good morning. I am well. How are you?
- 18 Q. Mr. Hoxha, yesterday we discussed the issue of the broken trucks
- 19 resting at a certain location of the compound of the Kukes metal
- factory. At page 93, lines 5 to 8 of the provisional transcript of
- yesterday, you told us that there were three to four broken trucks
- 22 placed somehow in the middle of the compound covering the view of the
- white building we discussed yesterday. You specifically said the
- 24 following:
- 25 "Where number 3 is, there were three or four trucks which were

- broken down and were parked there. Actually, I'm not sure if there
- were three or four. But that part of the courtyard cannot be seen.
- One could not see what was there."
- This is what you said.
- You repeated the issue of these three or four trucks, and you
- said that you could not see that part of the yard, and this is at
- page 96, lines 3 to 8, or that this part was not visible. You said
- 8 that at page 104, lines 24, 25, of the provisional transcript. And I
- 9 would like to first clarify the number of trucks that were there, the
- 10 broken down trucks.
- So yesterday you said there were three, maybe four trucks. You
- were not sure. However, I would like to put to you what you said
- during your SPO interview. Let's go to the document, not the video,
- 14 first.
- MR. MICHALCZUK: It should be on 077857-TR-ET Part 2, page 5,
- 16 lines 19 to 22.
- 17 PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: Please proceed,
- 18 Madam Court Officer.
- MR. AOUINI: Your Honours.
- 20 PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: Defence Counsel.
- MR. AOUINI: Sorry, Your Honours, but since this is a very
- important issue, we would love to have the Albanian version of the
- transcript available for alleviation of any concern.
- PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: We have the Albanian references,
- so maybe you also have it. If not, I leave it to you.

- MR. MICHALCZUK: Your Honours, I don't have it, but it should
- be -- that's the same page, around the same area.
- 3 PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: Okay. Very well.
- 4 MR. MICHALCZUK: In the Albanian transcript.
- PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: Please, Madam Court Officer,
- 6 could you bring up also the Albanian version.
- 7 MR. MICHALCZUK: In the English version, it would be lines 19
- 8 to 22.
- 9 PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: Line 21, we see "... ne kamion."
- 10 I'm not completely sure if that is the part.
- THE INTERPRETER: We believe it's page 6, Your Honour, of the
- 12 Albanian transcript, line 14.
- PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: Thank you. That was also the
- information I just received from my colleague. Yes, thank you.
- MR. MICHALCZUK: Can I proceed, Your Honour?
- PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: Yes. I was having a look at it.
- 17 You may. Our interpretation unit has told us what the corresponding
- lines are, and it's from line 14 on. Then we are set to go.
- 19 MR. MICHALCZUK: Yes.
- Q. Mr. Hoxha, in that part, and I'm going to read it to you, you
- said the following thing:
- "For example, on the -- near the warehouse, the metal work
- warehouse, there was a truck on that side. There was a truck broken
- down truck, and I slept in the truck."
- In the whole Part 2 of your statement, and I reviewed that

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- 1 yesterday, you only spoke about one truck being at the premises of
- the Kukes factory, and this is, indeed, the truck where you slept.
- 3 You also said that yesterday about that one truck where you slept.
- If there were, indeed, as you said yesterday, three or four
- broken trucks, that they were in the yard of the Kukes metal factory,
- 6 why did you tell the Prosecutor in 2020 only about one truck that was
- 5 broken down there?
- 8 A. To my knowledge, I've also stated back then that there were
- 9 three to four trucks. I said that I slept in one of them. But
- whether there were three or four, I'm not sure.
- 11 Q. Mr. Hoxha, you, indeed, mention several trucks coming and going,
- being parked at the premises of the Kukes metal factory. But when it
- comes to broken down trucks, in the SPO interview in the whole
- 14 interview you mentioned only one such truck that was broken down.
- 15 What would you say to that? Was there one truck, as you claimed
- before the Prosecutor in 2020, or three to four trucks, as you
- 17 claimed yesterday?
- 18 A. No, there were three or four trucks that were broken down.
- 19 Q. Very well. I would like to clarify also the issue of the exact
- 20 place where that broken down truck or trucks was or were located
- 21 within the Kukes metal factory.
- In your testimony that you gave yesterday, you placed the truck
- or trucks somehow in the middle of the compound covering the view of
- the white building that we discussed yesterday; correct?
- 25 A. Yes, that's correct.

- 1 Q. For instance, at page 107, lines 21 to 23 of the provisional
- transcript, you said, and I quote:
- "I know that I would bring my tables, desks outside and work
- just where those trucks were. Exactly where number 3 is. That's
- 5 where I would bring my desk outside and work."
- But I would like to show you part of your -- the video of the
- 7 SPO interview.
- 8 MR. MICHALCZUK: And that would be, Your Honours, 077857B
- 9 Part 2, RED. With your permission, Your Honour, I would use this
- video and ask Madam Court Officer to display it.
- 11 PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: Please proceed,
- 12 Madam Court Officer.
- MR. MICHALCZUK: My suggestion, also, would be to put on the
- right-hand side to the video the English transcript of it, and that
- would be 00857-TR-ET Part 2, page 5.
- 16 PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: Please proceed,
- 17 Madam Court Officer.
- MR. MICHALCZUK: It's page 5, and let's take a look at lines
- 19 from 16 to 25.
- I would like Madam Court Officer to play the video from 10:28
- and continue until 12:00.
- [Video-clip played]
- "Q. And if you can using the panoramic photo, can you point out
- where under the stars, so to speak, that you slept on occasion and
- also where the warehouse building is located?

- "The interpreter: [voiceover] So can you tell us in this
- 2 panoramic photograph where exactly you slept or when you slept
- outside the building, for instance, or inside the building itself.
- "A. And, for example, here, near the warehouse, the metal work
- 5 house, there was a truck on that side.
- "[Interpretation] Near the warehouse, the metal work warehouse,
- there was a truck on that side. There was a truck, a broken down
- 8 truck, and I -- I slept in the truck.
- 9 "Mr. Elderkin: I'm just going to use the camera here to show --
- am I pointing in the right place, roughly, for you to --
- "The interpreter: [voiceover] So is this the right place where
- 12 I'm pointing to?
- 13 "A. Yes.
- "Mr. Elderkin: So I will turn the camera -- so Mr. Hoxha has
- just said, yes, this is roughly the area where the broken down truck
- 16 was that I'm now showing to the recording camera.
- "Q. Was this broken down truck ..."
- MR. MICHALCZUK: Could we now move back to 11:45 and stop there.
- 19 PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: Please proceed,
- 20 Madam Court Officer.
- MR. MICHALCZUK: So the same video but just stop at that minute,
- 22 at that timestamp, 11 minutes, 45 seconds.
- Q. Mr. Hoxha, from that video that we have just played to you, you
- yourself indicated to the Prosecutor where the broken down truck was
- parked, was located. And it was, as we can see, on this image, it

- was not, as you claimed yesterday, in the middle of the yard, but it
- was rather next to the wall of the warehouse where you worked. Do
- 3 you confirm that?
- 4 A. Mr. Prosecutor, you are forgetting that this interview was given
- 5 20 years after the war. And, secondly, I was not prepared to be in
- an interview because I didn't think that these things would ever -- I
- 7 would ever need these things in my life. And when I actually gave
- 8 this interview, it could so happen that I may have been mistaken.
- 9 But now, in the past two years that I've been questioned again, I've
- 10 had time to think about the entire scene, what it was like, and to
- 11 the extent of my memory.
- But back then, I was not prepared when I was first asked. So it
- could so happen that I may have said a truck, but I'm telling you
- there were three or four instead.
- Q. Right now we are not discussing the number of trucks. Right now
- 16 we are discussing the position where the broken down truck was
- 17 located. And the Prosecutor, as I have just demonstrated, the
- Prosecutor pointed his finger at the location where the truck -- the
- 19 broken down truck was parked. He asked you do you agree that this is
- the location. You said, yes, it's there. And then in front of you,
- actually, you have it, the finger is pointing exactly at the place
- where is the wall of the warehouse. It doesn't point anywhere even
- near to the middle of the yard. Do you agree?
- 24 A. In actual fact, it's in parallel. It doesn't necessarily mean
- 25 that it was parked precisely by the wall. So it's in parallel, in

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- tandem where the trucks were parked. Otherwise, if one looks at the
- 2 recordings, all the while there are other parts when one would
- actually see the broken down trucks, but these are the three or four
- 4 because those trucks that were coming in and out were carrying
- 5 military materials but also foodstuffs. There were other trucks as
- 6 well, not just the ones that were broken down and parked. There were
- other trucks inside the courtyard of the metal factory.
- 8 So if you look at the film, for instance, at the footage, you
- 9 would actually see the other trucks, and I can show exactly which
- ones were the broken down ones.
- 11 Q. Yes.
- PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: Defence Counsel, you have the
- 13 floor.
- 14 MR. AOUINI: Thank you, Your Honour, and apologies.
- I think the witness might need to leave the courtroom for our
- objection, for a point of procedure on this.
- 17 PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: We will proceed in this way.
- Mr. Witness, you will be ushered out for a few minutes.
- [The witness stands down]
- PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: You have the floor,
- 21 Defence Counsel.
- MR. AOUINI: Thank you, Your Honour.
- And apologies for my interruption to my learned colleague.
- PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: Apologies are not needed in this
- courtroom for these kind of interventions.

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- 1 MR. AOUINI: Okay.
- Your Honour, we pointed yesterday, and this was a portion that
- my learned colleague mentioned to the witness to start with, and we
- want to re-indicate this portion at page 23, lines 15 to 19, where
- 5 this witness has spoken about --
- "... so there were, of course, even there trucks parked."
- So before engaging in one truck or many, this has to be
- 8 clarified, whether this witness means "parked" means part of the
- 9 broken ones that were parked, because you have combined parked and
- broken down. That is the first point, Your Honour. Out of fairness
- 11 for clarification.
- And the second thing is, as we can see now, and before it moves
- away, the photo that is shown is actually a panorama photo. That is,
- a lot of photos stuck together. So this is a point that we need to
- refer to because this has been an issue also with another part of the
- 16 compound.
- Those are points we want to alert to. Because if we are going
- to confront the witness, we have to give him the full image of the
- 19 situation in terms of the documents used and in terms of what he said
- in different parts.
- 21 Thank you, Your Honour.
- PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: Could you explain this panorama
- issue, because it's not clear to me.
- MR. AOUINI: In many places in the interview, there is a
- 25 reference to photos in the panorama --

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PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: But, I mean, specifically with 1 regard to this picture. I see a picture, and I see a finger, and I see the finger pointing at a place on the picture. What is the issue that you want to make with us with regard to the problem that it's a panorama picture? Because we are not looking at the whole panorama. 5 We are looking at this specific point. 6 MR. AOUINI: Yes, Your Honour. And I seize the opportunity that 7 the witness is not here, because there was the issue with the other 8 part where the witness has said that he didn't see - never saw - this 9 picture of the white building --10 PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: Yes. 11 MR. AOUINI: -- as it was. And so he said there was a panorama, 12 that's the only thing you showed me. And here we have the 13 14 opportunity to see bits that are stuck together, just to -- since we have the image to show Your Honours that it is not ERN by ERN 15 specific individual photos, but this is what is referred to as 16 panorama. 17 What we believe that we see, and from the transcripts, is that 18 collated photos have been put together to show to the witness. So 19 that's the point we wanted to alert to in order to understand and 20 maybe clarify things --21 PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: Okay. 2.2 MR. AOUINI: -- not to [Overlapping speakers]. 23 PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: You have clarified that. But 24

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with regard to this specific topic, I don't see an issue.

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- Mr. Prosecutor will be given the opportunity to react on this,
- and then I will say what I have to say.
- Mr. Prosecutor, is there something you want to submit?
- 4 MR. MICHALCZUK: Yes. First -- Your Honour, just a few very
- 5 short remarks.
- First of all, I'm not talking about trucks. I'm talking about
- broken down trucks only. Not the ones parked. Not the ones that
- 8 were coming and going. I'm talking only about the trucks the witness
- 9 mentioned several times yesterday himself. Two -- three to four
- broken down trucks, and I'm only focusing on this.
- Earlier today, I demonstrated that in the SPO interview he
- mentioned only one such broken down truck. Not any other truck;
- broken down truck. Later on, if you read the whole SPO transcript of
- the interview, the progression of the interview leaves no doubt that
- the Prosecutor was methodically discussing the issue of the broken
- down trucks, and the question also about where he slept. He said
- there was this place.
- And then immediately after, the witness was directed to indicate
- 19 the place where that broken down truck was located, and he showed
- that at the wall.
- So I don't believe that there is any doubt about the location
- that the witness himself mentioned at the SPO interview. That he's
- now departing from that, it's a wholly different issue. But I don't
- think that we presented this in any manner which is unfair to the
- 25 witness.

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PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: Thank you, Mr. Prosecutor.
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- 2 Does Victims' Counsel want to add something?
- MR. LAWS: No, thank you, Your Honour.
- 4 PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: Okay. Thank you.
- In this respect, Defence Counsel, what your request is to have a
- 6 portion put to the witness? That's the bottom -- no, no, you don't
- have to stand. Just a "yes" or "no." You want to have a certain
- 8 portion put to the witness in order to be fair to him?
- 9 MR. AOUINI: Yes. And it is about numbers, not about the place.
- 10 We agree that the place is what is shown here.
- PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: And then I will say to you that
- if you think that there's a need for clarification in redirect, you
- can put this specific point to him. But the questions that we have
- 14 had till now, in my view, and that was the reason that I was kind of
- hesitant to give you the floor, I think they are all relevant. I did
- not see any misleading. The portion put to him, and there's another
- 17 portion too, it's very clear that it's about broken trucks, and
- 18 yesterday we discussed broken trucks, and it was a question that I
- 19 would have posed. If the SPO would not have said that they would
- 20 have discussed it, I would have posed it right away at the start of
- 21 the testimony.
- So I -- your objection is -- oh. No, no.
- MR. GILISSEN: [Microphone not activated].
- PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: No, we are not going into
- 25 discussion.

- Defence Counsel --5
- MR. GILISSEN: [Microphone not activated]. 6

- Counsel, please -- no, I did not give you the floor. And you cannot 8
- stand up and just start talking through me. So no. I am now giving 9
- my ruling. 10

- 6 that car in the Kukes metal factory?
- 7 A. Yes, inside the courtyard.

- 9 PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: Mr. Prosecutor --
- 10 MR. MICHALCZUK: Yes.
- 11 PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: -- I see that Mr. Shala has
- raised his hand, so I will see what Mr. Shala wants to say.
- Mr. Shala, on what -- no, no, on what do you want to make --
- 14 no --
- THE ACCUSED: [via videolink] [Interpretation] Thank you.
- 16 PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: -- a comment.

- 19 Perhaps if you would allow me just for some consultation, some time

- 21 PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: Thank you, Mr. Shala. Well
- noted. We will have the break at 11.00, and you will be put into the
- position to consult with your lawyer. Yes?
- THE ACCUSED: [via videolink] [Interpretation] Thank you.

- Your answer was: 11
- "It was parked over there just by the truck or the lorry I 12

- That was not my task, to tell people where to park those trucks. 12

- And I understand that by the date these photos in the panorama were 1
- taken, a small building that used to exist at the position I showed
- you with my finger used to be there but had been destroyed. And
- there's a photograph on the page with ERN 074390. This is a 4
- structure that I understand used to exist at the position I showed 5
- you just now in the panorama." 6
- MR. MICHALCZUK: 7
- Mr. Hoxha, it was your interview with the SPO. And this is the 8
- building that we discussed yesterday at length. Do you still claim 9
- that you were not shown this white building during the SPO interview 10
- and that you never saw that photo before? 11
- I don't remember seeing this photograph. When they showed me 12
- the photographs of the metal factory, they were long. There were two 13
- parts of the buildings. But in the middle, where you are saying that 14
- this part was, it was stuck with Sellotape in the middle, but I never 15
- saw this building. 16
- Mr. Witness, I would like to just recap what we heard from you 17
- about this building today and yesterday. So you worked in the 18
- warehouse, the entrance of which was in the same courtyard as this 19
- white building. You stated that, at times, you worked out of the 20

- 25 I would like to very quickly ask you about some locations where

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- you slept while in the Kukes metal factory. So, for now, we have 1
- established that you slept for some time in the warehouse where you

- night or two max. I'm not sure about how many nights, but one or two 6
- 7 nights only.

- Α. Yes. 11
- You also mentioned certain room. It was the office of 12

- Yes, 95 per cent of the times I would sleep there. 16
- Did you sleep also in other locations, apart from those that I 17

- MR. MICHALCZUK: Your Honours, very quickly I would like to put 20
- on the screen the SPO interview. It's 077857-TR-ET Part 1, page 18. 21

- 1 Arrow operation. All the brigades that came into Kosovo from Krume
- 2 would come to that -- would pass through our barracks. They would

- 4 circulation. This would also happen at night, not only during the
- 5 day.
- Q. Was it a noisy place?
- 7 A. No, I wouldn't say noisy. Normal noise, normal sounds made by
- 8 people circulating. But everybody had their own tasks, their own
- 9 responsibilities.
- 10 Q. You have just told us that it was -- it was the place where
- people were coming and going, trucks were coming and going. I
- understand it was a logistical hub where trucks were coming to get
- supplies, they were loading stuff, offloading stuff; correct?
- 14 A. Yes.
- Q. Did you ever see non-military vehicles parked inside the
- 16 courtyard?
- 17 A. In fact, we did not have any military vehicles. All of our
- vehicles were civilian. As I said yesterday, we did not have our own
- 19 state. We did not have a regular army. That was a voluntary army.
- 20 And people donated things to the army. Somebody would bring a
- vehicle, somebody would bring a jeep, and everything was voluntary
- because it wasn't an obligation to anyone. So all our equipment and
- vehicles were civilian. I can't say that any of them were military.
- Q. So on some of the videos, there were trucks in the yard coming
- and going and parked; correct?

- Α. Yes. 1
- There were also smaller cars, like lorries. We saw one blue

- license plates were Swiss license plates. They were not military. 6
- And many of the vehicles there did not have license plates at all 7
- because we did not have the right to use Albanian license plates. 8

- Α. It had German license plates. 11

- witness a very short part of his statement. It's 077857-TR-ET

- 19 then I didn't know where they were distributed to from Tirana. What
- 20 we did was send those supplies to Tirana, and then drivers were

- sent to Tirana, and then where they were sent onwards from Tirana I
- don't know.

- And also it's not about Tirana, this exchange, because it's

- Germany to there. Namely, to Kukes. What would you say to that? 6
- Directly to Kukes? No, I've never sent military supplies 7
- directly to Kukes myself. And I sent those from Germany to Albania, 8
- not directly to Kukes. Because when I got to Kukes, I didn't even 9
- have a weapon, and then I received my weapon in Kukes. Because 10

So I don't know if perhaps the Defence have, in the meantime, been able to have those statements translated, or whether Your Honours would like to proceed for this specific situation, given also the short time between today and possibly tomorrow, the start of the testimony, to proceed as we have done before, or in whatever best way the Judges think would be best to proceed.

I just wanted to raise this matter because of the directions we 21 received this morning. 22

PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: Yes, very well. The directions 23 apply in principle -- and I will give you the floor. In principle to 24 25 the prior statements we have been using up to now where we had an

- 9 PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: Okay. Now you are repeating
- 10 yourself.
- 11 THE WITNESS: [Interpretation] -- has put there with their --
- PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: I have overrided you, so you are
- not being translated. And we don't allow you to call this Court
- 14 ridiculous. It's not necessary to use those -- no, those type of
- 15 terms. No, but --
- THE WITNESS: [Interpretation] [Microphone not activated].
- 17 PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: You are not having the floor.
- THE WITNESS: [Interpretation] [Microphone not activated].
- 19 PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: No, no, no. No, you will not get
- the floor, and I am overriding you, so you will not be translated.
- 21 Madam Prosecutor, you may put your next question if this has
- been sufficiently answered.
- MS. PERGOLO: Thank you, Your Honours.
- Q. Madam Witness, at the time you made this Facebook, or reposted
- this post, were you familiar with the charges brought by this

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- Tribunal against Pjeter Shala? 1
- I have never read the indictment against Pjeter Shala because I
- wasn't interested in an indictment which is based on stitched-up
- allegations of false witnesses. 4
- Tell me, Madam Prosecutor, why am I sitting here today? Where 5
- I'm sitting here, you could be sitting. Did you know Pjeter Shala in 6
- 1999? Did you know his name, Pjeter Shala's name? Were you a 7
- doctor? Of course not. 8
- PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: Madam Witness --9
- THE WITNESS: [Interpretation] [Microphone not activated]. 10
- PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: -- you are not being translated 11
- 12 anymore, and I know you can understand me.
- THE WITNESS: [Interpretation] [Microphone not activated]. 13
- PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: You know -- I know that you heard 14
- what I said to you. You are not the one asking the questions here. 15
- Please answer the questions that are posed to you. 16
- Madam Prosecutor, you may continue. 17
- MS. PERGOLO: Thank you, Madam Presiding Judge. 18
- Witness, I have one last question for you, and then I will ask 19
- that the last exhibit be pulled up. But, first of all, I would like 20
- to ask you also whether you are familiar with the charges that were 21
- brought against Salih Mustafa? 22
- I don't even want to read the indictments. The charges from the 23
- secret -- Serbian secret service, stitched-up allegations, I don't 24
- want to read them. 25

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- MS. PERGOLO: May I have then the last exhibit, which is 1
- SPOE00342377 to 00342379, page 1, and the corresponding English
- translation is the same ERN.
- PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: Please proceed,
- Madam Court Officer. 5
- And, Madam Witness, when the question is posed to you, please
- 7 stay calm in your answer.
- MS. PERGOLO: 8
- Madam Witness, do you recognise this post? 9
- Α. Yes. 10
- I'll read briefly what it says in the translation: 11
- "We are all Cali! 12
- "False, wretched, fabricated testimonies, let them weigh heavy 13
- 14 on the conscience of everybody who has given them, and who has fallen
- in the trap of the genocidal Serbian regime. 15
- "False testimonies are also punishable. I believe that the 16
- domestic and international justice, which have fallen down, would one 17
- day sober up." 18
- Now, Madam Witness, I have a question for you. You told us that 19
- you have not read the indictment against Salih Mustafa. Then how can 20
- you state that the charges -- or the evidence, the witnesses in that 21
- case, are false and fabricated? 22
- Every statement that has been given against the KLA members, 23
- when, in fact, they actually liberated us and fought fairly, is 24
- 25 fabricated. Perhaps today I would have written it even more strongly

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- since I'm sitting here on false testimony. And I just understood 1
- this today, because I didn't know until I got here today why I'd been
- called to The Hague. I just didn't know why.
- I didn't know how you even came up with my name to summon me
- here. So you have found it. You based it on false testimony. And 5
- if I actually could, I would improve what I've put in there. 6
- Because, of course, there were cases, like, for me, here today as a 7
- witness, that are based on false testimony, based on stitched-up 8
- allegations of the Serbian secret services. And what can you say to 9
- that? Of course, for this there must have been a case like mine. 10
- Although, I don't know. 11
- That is why I say that it is a shame. 12
- PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: Just for you to know that you are 13
- 14 here on request of the Defence. Just to remind you of that.
- Madam Prosecutor, you have the floor. 15
- MS. PERGOLO: Your Honours, if you allow me one moment, please, 16
- to confer with my colleague. 17
- PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: Yes, we are going to wrap --18
- MS. PERGOLO: Yup. 19
- PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: -- up. 20
- [Specialist Prosecutors confer] 21
- MS. PERGOLO: Your Honours, this concludes our 22
- cross-examination. Thank you. 23
- PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: Very well. 24
- MS. PERGOLO: 25

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- Ο. Thank you, Madam Witness. 1
- PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: Thank you.
- Victims' Counsel, I'm going to do the planning for tomorrow.
- you have any questions for this witness? 4
- MR. LAWS: Very few. 5
- PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: Okay.
- MR. LAWS: Probably five minutes. I'm very happy to do it now, 7
- if it's possible, but --8
- PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: Yes, but -- let us see, I think 9
- that the day -- the time for today is what it is. 10
- MR. LAWS: Yes, I understand. 11
- PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: Mr. Shala, I will give you the 12
- floor after I have finalised this part. 13
- 14 Defence Counsel, is there -- can you already oversee if you
- would like to have a second round? 15
- MR. GILISSEN: No, thank you very much. But before giving the 16
- floor to Mr. Shala, I'd prefer to have a contact with him. 17
- PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: Very well. But then I can tell 18
- Mr. Shala that he can be given the floor tomorrow, because I don't 19
- see how we could, within the limited time that we have at our 20
- disposal at this moment in time --21
- MR. GILISSEN: It could be very brief. 22
- PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: -- create that. So I will tell 23
- Mr. Shala that you will talk with him later this afternoon, and then 24
- he can choose to be given --25

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- MR. GILISSEN: Yeah. 1
- PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: He can choose to be ask for the
- floor tomorrow. Okay?
- MR. GILISSEN: Thank you very much.
- PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: Mr. Shala, your lawyer has asked 5
- me to convey to you that he will discuss with you this afternoon. 6
- And then if there is anything you would like to share with the Panel, 7
- you can do that tomorrow when we continue with the examination of the 8
- witness. 9
- I won't give you the floor on request of your lawyer. No, 10
- Mr. Shala. 11
- Madam Witness, thank you for your testimony you have been giving 12
- to us today. I wish you a restful evening. Madam Court Usher will 13
- 14 usher you out, and we see each other back at 9.30 tomorrow. I
- foresee that it will not be a long session. And please don't discuss 15
- your testimony with anybody. Thank you again. You can leave 16
- together with Madam Court Usher. 17
- No, not now. No, Madam Witness, for now it's over. 18
- [The witness stands down] 19
- PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: Thank you, Madam Court Usher. 20
- Before we adjourn, is there anything that parties and 21
- Victims' Counsel would like to raise with the Panel? 22
- MS. PERGOLO: No, Your Honours, thank you. 23
- MR. LAWS: No, thank you, Your Honour. 24
- MR. GILISSEN: Thank you, Your Honours. Nothing. 25
