Court Officer, could you please call the case. 6 THE COURT OFFICER: Good morning, Your Honours. This is case 7 KSC-BC-2020-04, The Specialist Prosecutor versus Pjeter Shala. 8 PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: Thank you. 9 10 First of all, I kindly ask the parties and Victims' Counsel to introduce themselves, starting with the Specialist Prosecutor's 11 Office. 12 MR. DE MINICIS: Good morning, Your Honours. Today for the 13 14 Prosecution, Line Pedersen, our case manager; Giulia Bianchi, our legal intern; Filippo De Minicis, Eva Wyler, Gaia Pergolo, Associate 15 Prosecutors. 16 PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: Thank you. Victims' Counsel, you have the floor. MR. LAWS: Good morning to Your Honours and to everyone. I'm

- Simon Laws, counsel for the victims in this case together with my 20
- 21 co-counsel, Maria Radziejowska.
- PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: Thank you. 22
- Now the Defence, please. 23
- MR. GILISSEN: Good morning, Your Honours. I am 24
- Mr. Jean-Louis Gilissen, lead counsel. We here with 25

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Mr. Pjeter Shala. And I am here with Hedi Aouini, my co-counsel, and

- my second co-counsel, Ms. Leto Cariolou, and Ms. Dzeneta Petravica, 2
- our case manager. And then we are here with Juliette Healy, evidence 3
- review assistant; Francisca De Castro, evidence review assistant too;
- Judit Kolbe, evidence review assistant too; Ms. Xhulia Tepshi, it's 5
- an intern and it's a very important person today, that's our 6
- translator for Mr. Shala. And then we are here with 7
- Ms. Camille Gosson, an intern from France. 8
- Thank you very much. 9
- PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: Okay. Thank you very much. 10
- Today we start with the presentation of the evidence, especially 11
- the presentation by the Specialist Prosecutor, and today we will be 12
- hearing the testimony of the SPO witness number 08. 13
- As already communicated by -- to you by CMU, we will have three 14
- session from 9.30, so now, till 11.00; then from 11.30 till 1.00. 15
- have a one-hour break, and then we have a session from 2.00 till 16
- 4.00. That's the idea. And the same goes for Tuesday and for 17
- Wednesday, and then on -- we will see where we stand then. 18
- 19 And on Thursday and Friday we revert to the original schedule of
- every time one and a half hour. That's the idea. 20
- Before we start with the testimony of the witness, the Panel 21
- will issue two oral orders. 22
- The first oral order concerns the items that the SPO intends to 23
- use during their questioning of three of the witnesses whom we will 24
- be hearing this week; that is, 08, 07 and 09. 25

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- The SPO has requested to be allowed to use two newly disclosed 1
- maps. The request was made via e-mail on 21 March, last week, at six 2
- minutes past 6.00 in the afternoon. The maps were disclosed on the 3
- same day, shortly after, which was at nine minutes past 6.00 in the 4
- afternoon, which is disclosure package 110. 5
- The Defence has responded on 23 March 2003 via e-mail at 1442. 6
- It regrets the late disclosure, it communicated to the Panel. 7
- However, the Defence sees their utility and does not oppose to the 8
- SPO request. 9
- 10 And the Victims' Counsel has not raised any objections.
- For the following reasons, the Panel decides to authorise the 11
- SPO to use the two maps during their questioning of the witnesses 12
- pursuant to paragraph 44 of the Decision on the Conduct of 13
- 14 Proceedings, which is filing F434.
- The maps were only recently created and were disclosed promptly 15
- thereafter. The Defence and Victims' Counsel have had sufficient 16
- time to study them. Their use will facilitate the witness 17
- testimonies, and the Defence and Victims' Counsel do not oppose to 18
- the request. 19
- This concludes our first oral order. 20
- Then there is a second oral order which concerns the Panel's 21
- direction in the Decision on the Conduct of Proceedings that the 22
- parties and Victims' Counsel shall indicate in advance any passage 23
- they intend to use with any of the documents longer than two pages 24
- when questioning witnesses. This is the filing 434, paragraphs 46 25

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and 48. And on 20 March 2023, the Defence requested the Panel, via

e-mail sent at 19.43, to direct the SPO to indicate the passages it 2

intends to put to the Witness 08 and 06 from the documents it intends 3

to use which the SPO had not done.

And alternatively, the Defence requested the Panel to clarify

its directions in case it was misunderstood. 6

The SPO responded on 21 March via e-mail at 10.41 in the 7

morning. And we ruled on the issue on 21 March 2023 also via e-mail 8

at 12.26. And the Panel hereby puts its ruling on record because you 9

already know what we have ruled but we want to have in public and not

only via e-mail, of course. So we have to go through this formality,

but it is important to have it on record and that everybody can read

it. And we clarify that its direction applies to materials other 13

than prior statements of the witnesses. The extent to which the

parties and Victims' Counsel will uses prior statements during their

questioning, if at all, will depend, of course, on the witness 16

testimonies in court. For instance, on the need to refresh their 17

memory or to confront them with any prior inconsistent statements. 18

19 It is not possible for parties or Victims' Counsel to foresee which

exact portions of the prior statements they will put to the

witnesses. 21

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And then eight of the items that the SPO intends to use with 22

Witness 08 and 06 are written prior statements of the witnesses, and

in line with the rationale I just set out, the Panel saw no need to

direct the SPO to amend its list of materials in relation to these 25

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- 1 items.
- There is one item which is not a prior statement, and that is
- ERN 061216-061218 RED, appearing on the list related to Witness 08. 3
- And the Panel equally saw no need to order the SPO to amend its list 4
- in this particular situation because the SPO indicated already in its 5
- response the passage it intended to use, thereby notifying the 6
- Defence and Victims' Counsel, and it's really not lengthy. So we 7
- don't see a problem in that. 8
- And this concludes the Panel's second order. 9
- 10 Lastly, one point I would like to discuss. Defence Counsel, we
- have taken notice of your request for an extension of the time, 11
- filing 467. 12
- And now in this respect I turn to the SPO. Mr. Prosecutor, are 13
- 14 you today in a position to respond to the Defence request orally?
- MR. DE MINICIS: Your Honours, in light of the circumstances and 15
- of the hearings scheduled for this week, we will not oppose a 16
- reasonable extension that the Panel may see fit. 17
- PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: Okay. That's really quick. 18
- Thank you. 19
- I will come to Victims' Counsel later on. 20
- There's a second point. 21
- Mr. Prosecutor, would it, for the Specialist Prosecutor's 22
- Office, be possible to inform the Panel already at this stage when 23
- you will be calling Witness 01? We know that based on the conduct of 24
- proceedings, it's not due yet, but it would be -- it may be helpful 25

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- to know in which -- and it's not necessary to respond now. You can
- also respond later on. But it would be useful to know if you would
- 3 be calling him or her already for the first week of May or at a later
- 4 stadium. It may help in the assessment of the request from the
- 5 Defence.
- MR. DE MINICIS: Your Honour, I will probably get back to you
- with a bit more precision maybe later during this hearing, but we are
- 8 not currently minded to call him in the next evidentiary block.
- 9 Perhaps the one after that. I mean, most likely, so ...
- 10 PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: Thank you.
- 11 Thank you, Mr. Prosecutor.
- 12 Victims' Counsel, are you in a position to respond to the
- Defence request orally today? And I'm talking about filing 467.
- MR. LAWS: We have no objection to that, Your Honour. Thank
- 15 you.
- PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: Thank you. Very well.
- Then we can now proceed with the witness testimony.

- never mention your name but we will only refer to you as
- "Mr. Witness." In that way, we make sure that the public does not
- know your name. You also have face and voice distortion, which means
- that no one outside the courtroom watching the broadcast can see your
- face or hear your voice, your real voice, during the testimony.
- When you reply to questions that will not reveal your identity,
- we will do that in open session, which means that the public can hear
- 19 what is said in the courtroom.
- When you are asked to describe anything that relates
- specifically to you or that can reveal your identity, we will do so
- in private session, and that means that there is no broadcast and no
- one outside the courtroom can hear what is said in the courtroom.
- And if anything is said during open session that may identify
- who you are, we will protect that information.

- Your testimony will be broadcasted with a delay, and we can
- remove any such information from the broadcast that can be seen and 2
- 3 heard by the public, and from the public transcript of the
- proceedings. 4
- Are the protective measures that I just explained to you, are 5
- they clear to you, Mr. Witness? 6
- THE WITNESS: [Interpretation] Yes, fully. 7
- PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: Thank you. 8
- Needless to say, I request the parties and Victims' Counsel to 9
- 10 respect such protective measures and we should all pay the utmost
- attention in the course of our examination to avoid disclosure of any 11
- confidential information. 12
- The hearing is held in open session unless otherwise requested 13
- 14 by you, and then we will revert to private session.
- I also remind you to adhere to the procedure for in-court 15
- redactions as set out in paragraph 53 till 55 in the Decision on the 16
- Conduct of Proceedings. And if we all act diligently in this 17
- respect, we will have a minimal amount of non-in-court redactions and 18
- that would be good result. 19
- Very well. 20
- Mr. Witness, I turn back to you. You are called to testify 21
- before the Specialist Chambers in the case of The Specialist 22
- Prosecutor versus Pjeter Shala to assist the Panel Judges to reach a 23
- verdict. After you have taken your solemn declaration to tell the 24
- truth, you will be asked questions by the lawyers for the 25

- 7 I would like to provide you with some guidance for answering the
- questions that you will be asked.
- Please, Mr. Witness, listen carefully to each question that will
- be posed to you and if you don't understand it, please feel free to
- have the question repeated again. We want you to tell the truth. We
- want you to tell us what you saw, what you heard, what you
- experienced or sensed yourself. So if you found out in another way,
- please tell us and explain us how. And if you don't remember all the
- details, that is not a problem. It is perfectly fine to say, "I
- don't know" or "I don't remember." And you should not be guessing.
- 17 Please.
- Please answer the questions. And if more information is needed
- or if things should be clarified, there will come a follow-up
- question and you will be given the opportunity to make it more clear,
- if necessary.
- Do you understand all this?
- THE WITNESS: [Interpretation] Yes.
- PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: Very well. There's also some
- 25 practical advice I would like to give you in relation to the

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- answering of the questions, Mr. Witness, and that is that everything
- that we say here is translated and recorded. So it is important for
- you to speak into the microphone, to speak clearly, and to speak at a
- 4 slow pace. And this will allow the interpreters, who are sitting
- 5 upstairs, to translate -- to interpret everything.
- And what is also very important is that you should only start
- 7 speaking when the person asking you the question has finished the
- question. And when a question is asked, you should wait five seconds
- 9 before starting with your answer because this will allow the
- interpreters to finish, to translate what you have just said, and if
- not, it will be overlapping. And it might be difficult at the
- beginning, but if it is going too fast, I will interrupt you.
- If I raise my hand, please stop talking. And sometimes I might
- ask you to take off your headphones and then you will be ushered out
- the courtroom because if there is a question with relation to the
- 16 content of your testimony, sometimes we have to discuss it, and then
- it's better that you wait outside in order not to be influenced.
- If you have any questions, if you need a break, or if there is
- something you would like to communicate, please raise your hand and I
- 20 will give you the floor. Yes?
- 21 Have you understood all this, too, Mr. Witness?
- THE WITNESS: [Interpretation] Yes. Thank you.
- PRESIDING JUDGE VELDT-FOGLIA: Very well. As I must do with
- every witness, I will now ask you to read the solemn declaration to
- tell the truth. And I remind you it is an offence to give a false
