- 7 A. Yes, this is Jakup Krasniqi.
- 8 Q. Do you recall the event depicted in the photograph?

- recognise what this building is, and can you again describe it,

- 7 government were there. We are speaking of the time after
- 8 Rambouillet.
- 9 Q. Is that when this building was first used?
- 10 A. No. It was used also before that when we, staff members, were
- 11 there before we settled in Divjake.
- MS. LAWSON: Can we please go to page 294.
- 13 Q. The building depicted in the photographs on the top, do you
- 14 recognise where that is?
- 15 A. Based on the photograph and the events at the time, this was in
- the village of Luzhnica.
- 17 Q. Have you been there?
- 18 A. Yes, in June 1998.
- 19 MS. LAWSON: Your Honour, I'd like to tender the document
- please. And for the Albanian, I'll just tender the page range that

- 7 Q. Do you recognise this document, and could you please describe
- 8 what it is?
- 9 A. Yes, I recognise it. It's my document signed by me. It bears
- the General Staff stamp. It's an order concerning the reporting from
- commanders and how they should report when they come to the
- headquarters and what their report should include.
- Q. So we can see that it's convening a meeting for 29 December.
- MS. LAWSON: And I'd like to show you a further document from

you're recording as saying that it reports to both the commander and 1

- the chief of staff. Can you explain what you meant by that? 2
- The information directorate at the time was supposed to report
- not only to commander but also to the chief of staff on the events,
- what had happened, so that they are brought to the knowledge of the 5
- chief of staff. When I said "information," certain reports can be 6
- taken from the chief of staff, although most of the reports came from 7
- the zone commanders. If there was need for information, the chief of 8
- staff had to be informed so that he could further inform the public 9
- opinion or the units. 10
- Would these reports from the intelligence directorate be oral or 11
- in writing? 12
- It depended on the situation. Mostly they were oral. 13
- 14 And do you know whether you and the commander received the exact
- same information, or do you know what the substance of the reports 15
- going to the commander were? 16
- At the time, as far as I remember, both sides would take the 17
- 18 same information, but I was personally mostly interested in
- information of military nature. 19
- And when it's referring to the commander here, would that be 20
- referring to whoever was in Kosovo, such as the deputy commander, or 21
- is it referring to the commander in Albania? 22
- To both the commander in Albania and the commander in Kosovo, 23
- but mostly to the one in Kosovo because that commander would receive 24
- 25 the report directly.

MS. LAWSON: We can go back to page 1, please. And slightly 1

- further down on the Albanian.
- So it mentions that there were three units directly under the
- General Staff. Could you please describe what those units were?
- The subordinate units of the General Staff were the 5
- reconnaissance battalion, the military police at the General Staff, 6
- 7 and the logistics company of the General Staff. These are the three
- subordinate units of the General Staff. 8
- So starting with logistics, could you please explain its 9
- functions and mention who the commander was, although I think you 10
- mentioned him already in the testimony. 11
- The logistics unit at the General Staff had as task to support 12
- and assist the General Staff in terms of food, clothing, shelter, and 13
- 14 so forth. I just mentioned the key aspects. The commander of this
- unit was Idriz Hysenaj. 15
- And was this the unit that was based in the building we saw just 16
- adjacent to the white house? 17
- Α. Yes. 18
- So we'll take the military police next. Could you please 19
- describe its functions? 20
- The military police at the General Staff had as a task to 21
- provide security for the General Staff, to escort the General Staff 22
- through its movements in the territory of Kosovo. So its main task 23
- was to provide security and safety for the General Staff. A 24
- commander of this unit was Ramiz Sertolli. 25

- How had the members of the unit been selected? Q. 1
- Members of the military police unit, you mean?
- Yes, the General Staff military police unit. 3 Q.
- The members of this unit were selected from all the units from
- all the zones. Those who were distinguished as soldiers and fighters 5
- and were with best characteristics. 6
- 7 Were they nominated by the zones or who made the selection?
- The staff would ask the zone commanders because they knew the 8 Δ
- soldiers better, and then they would send these soldiers to this 9
- unit. 10
