6	PRESIDING JUDGE SMITH: Mr. Court Officer, please call the case.
7	THE COURT OFFICER: Good morning, Your Honours. This is the
8	file number KSC-BC-2020-06, The Specialist Prosecutor versus
9	Hashim Thaci, Kadri Veseli, Rexhep Selimi, and Jakup Krasniqi. Thank
10	you, Your Honours.
11	PRESIDING JUDGE SMITH: Thank you.
12	I note the accused are all present in court today with the
13	exception of Mr. Krasniqi, who continues to appear by videolink.
14	Before we begin with W01978's testimony today, I'd like to
15	address a few matters.
16	First of all, we have some oral orders. Short, short oral
17	orders.
18	First, an oral order regarding W03865's statements, which were
19	admitted as P01136.1 to P01136.4.
20	I recall that following inter partes discussions, the SPO
21	provided several revised translations of portions of these statements
22	as listed in the e-mail sent by the SPO on 30 April 2024 at 5.42.
23	I direct CMU to add these revised translations as subnumbers to
24	P1136.1 to P1136.4.
25	This concludes my first oral order.

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Second, I recall that on 29 April 2024 the statements of W03865 1 were admitted as P01135. As discussed at transcript pages 15084 to 2 15085, SPOE00200418 was missing from the Albanian translation of 3 P1135. It has now been disclosed in Disclosure Package 1220 and 4 added to P01135-AT. 5 This means that P1138, the number which had initially been 6 assigned to the associated exhibit which is now included in P01135, 7 can now be vacated. I therefore direct CMU to vacate P01138. 8 This concludes my second oral order. 9 Third, for the record that the Krasniqi Defence submitted the 10 following clarification to transcript of 1 May 2024 at pages 15342 to 11 15343. 12 As stated by counsel for Mr. Krasniqi, the correct ERN of the 13 14 document used with W04371 at transcript page 15309 was 060178-060189 RED2. Counsel for Mr. Krasniqi used the reference on page 060182, 15 which is outside of the page range admitted in P01143. That is 16 clarified. 17 Having said that, we kindly remind parties and participants to 18 add to their presentation queues the documents they intend to bring 19 up during their examination in all versions. 20 Lastly, I note that the requested translations of P01150 MFI and 21 P01151 MFI were disclosed in Disclosure Package 1221. 22 Any objection to the admission of these exhibits and their 23 translations as disclosed? 24

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No objection being heard, P01150 MFI and P01151 MFI are

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1 admitted.

2 Mr. Court Officer, please lift the MFI status of these exhibits 3 and assign an exhibit number.

THE COURT OFFICER: Thank you, Your Honours. The evidentiary status of the read exhibit numbers will be changed to admitted, and the revised translations will be added to already assigned exhibit numbers. Thank you, Your Honours.

8 PRESIDING JUDGE SMITH: Finally, I just have some general 9 comments to make.

About two weeks ago, we began the second year of testimony in this case. We actually began our discussions on this case in mid-December of 2022, days after the case was handed over to the Trial Panel by the Pre-Trial Judge.

On the occasion of that first Status Conference on 16 December 14 2022, we pledged that dealing with this case in a fair and 15 expeditious manner was of primary concern to the Panel. On that day 16 we asked the assistance of the Prosecution, the Defence teams and the 17 Victims' Counsel to help us to accomplish that goal. Over the next 18 year, we reiterated our requests, sought submissions from all 19 involved, adopted various measures and procedures that were proposed 20 by others or devised by the Panel, held conferences, and, when 21 necessary, ordered certain procedures all with a view to ensure that 22 the trial was conducted not just fairly but also expeditiously and 23 efficiently. 24

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In these efforts, there was a real spirit of cooperation by all

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which the Panel appreciates and for which we would like to express 1 our gratitude. While we will continue to strive for efficiency, we 2 are grateful for the contribution that all have made to this 3 collective endeavour thus far. 4 At the very beginning, the Prosecution estimated that it would 5 call 320 witnesses. They have since reduced that number and will 6 7 report this month on what we hope to be another reduction of the number of proposed witnesses. 8 The remaining witnesses will continue to come to us in various 9 formats - some live, some in writing. Up to this point, we have 10 heard 60 witnesses in court, which includes Rule 154 witnesses. In 11 addition, we admitted the statements of 13 witnesses pursuant to 12 Rule 153. Finally, we have admitted under Rule 155 the statements of 13 14 32 witnesses who, since their statements were given, died or are presently unavailable for some reason. 15 With the efforts of all concerned, the number of 16

Prosecution-called witnesses who testified in these various and valid formats is on this day 105.

For the record, since the Trial Panel has been seized of the case, 427 filings or submissions seeking a decision were filed by the parties and participants and 367 decisions of the Panel, written or oral, were rendered dealing with those requests, motions, and submissions.

The work generated by these litigations had to be undertaken by all in addition to the work performed in the courtroom. This

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constitutes an extraordinary amount of work by all involved, not just Judges and counsel, but also by their staff to whom we also express our gratitude.

We still have a lot of work to do and we will continue to prompt, push, and inquire to ensure that this trial continues to move along fairly, efficiently, and expeditiously. I am hopeful that we will continue the good cooperation of all. We can all still do better, and when I say "all," I include the Panel as well.

9 However, today I think we can safely recognise the completion of 10 100-plus witnesses in a year without seeming to rest upon our 11 laurels. As I previously said, this is a complicated case. To all 12 involved - lawyers, legal officers, staff members, Court Management 13 Unit, the Registry, interpreters, and translators - thank you for the 14 effort and your cooperation.

15 And now we'll carry on.

Today we will hear the evidence of Prosecution Witness W01978. Madam Court Officer, please bring us into private session for the privacy of the witness and others. Or Mr. Court Officer, I'm sorry.

6 The Prosecution estimate for your direct examination is 7 45 minutes. Victims' Counsel will take approximately 15 minutes for 8 questions. The Defence estimates that they will need approximately 9 two hours altogether. As regards each estimate, we hope that counsel 10 will be judicious in the use of their time. The Panel may also allow 11 redirect examination by the Prosecution if conditions are met.

Witness, please try to answer the questions clearly with short sentences. If you don't understand a question, feel free to ask the attorneys to repeat the question. Or if you don't understand, tell them that and they will try to clarify. Also, please try to indicate the basis of your knowledge of facts and circumstances that you will be asked about.

In the event you are asked by the SPO to attest to some corrections made regarding your statement, you are reminded to confirm on the record that the written statement, as corrected by the list of corrections, accurately reflects your declaration.

Please also speak into the microphone, wait five seconds before answering a question, and speak at a slow pace for the interpreters to catch up.

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During the next days while you are giving evidence in this
